SCHOOL

- Religious School on Sundays was successful as we continue to have MULTI-AGE CLASSES. Students in Hebrew School made great progress this year, mastering many prayers and blessings and forming a wonderful community across grades.
- Implemented a four-week session of JEWISH YOGA for our older students.
- Formed Kol Kolot, a **CHILDREN'S CHOIR**. They practiced and sang at two different Shabbat services throughout the year.
- Put on a **TEMPLE WIDE BROWNIE CHALLENGE**, pitting the school versus the rest of the community to see who could donate the most batches of brownies. Thirty-six batches of brownies were then donated to the

- Lowell Transitional Living Center.
- Continued implementing elements of the **ONWARD HEBREW PROGRAM** including Jewish Life Vocabulary through the weekly word of the week and Hebrew Through Movement, which is an opportunity to hear and respond to Hebrew words. In addition, we were able to hold Shacharit Services once a month and held a few Wednesday Maariv services, allowing the student body to engage in more t'fillah, which supports the development of Hebrew.
- Our tzedakah efforts this year went towards the **ISRAEL GUIDE DOG CENTER**, which helps to train dogs in Israel to become seeing-eye guide dogs and service dogs. We adopted Tasha (guide dog to be) and watched her grow and learn to become a guide dog as we went over our collection goal.
- Fun and meaningful **HANUKKAH PARTY** and **PURIM CELEBRATION**, in which we partnered with the Shalomites.
- Held the 6th annual Hanukkiah (Hanukkah menorah) contest.
- Strong **MADRICHIM PROGRAM**, having young adults work with teachers and students to support learning in Religious School and Hebrew School
- Chai Schoolers spent time **LEARNING THE UKULELE**, exploring ideas of God, learning about the Holocaust, learning about and creating Stop Motion videos with the theme of community and preparing for Confirmation.
- We offered FREE MONTHLY SHABBAT DINNERS for the school community before a Family Shabbat service.
